REQUIREMENTS FOR PUBLICATIONS:

Category	REQUIREMENTS
Relevance of Publications	The article should address relevant scientific and practical issues within the conference's theme
Responsibility	The author or team of authors is responsible for the content and accuracy of the submitted materials
Article length	3–6 pages, A4 format
File format	Microsoft Word (.doc, .docx)
Page numbering	No page numbering
Margins	Top, bottom, left, right margins – 20 mm
Paragraph indentation	1.00 cm paragraph indentation (without spaces or tabs)
Line spacing	1.0 line spacing
Font	Times New Roman, 12 pt
Text alignment	Justified text alignment
Page format	A4 (210x297 mm), portrait orientation
UDC	Mandatory UDC index assignment
ORCID ID	Mandatory ORCID ID for each author
Annotation	In English is required
Keywords	Keywords in English, no more than 10 words
Text formatting	No page breaks. Pages must not contain headers, footers, footnotes, or annotations.
References and footnotes	References should be listed at the end of the article under the "Bibliography" section. In-text citations should be enclosed in square brackets, indicating the source's serial number in the list and the page number, separated by a comma. Example: [1, p. 98-112].
Illustration formatting	Figures should be in JPG format. PrintScreen images are allowed, but they must be clear. All figures must be embedded in the article text (not as separate files). Images must be clear and legible. Each figure must have a number and a title below it (e.g., Fig. 1. Investment Dynamics in Industry). If the figure is borrowed, the source should be indicated [Author, title of the work, year of publication, page]. If created by the author(s), it should be marked as: "Source: Compiled/developed by the author(s)."
Table formatting requirements	Tables must be embedded in the article text (not as separate files). Screenshots of tables are not allowed – data must be inserted as text. Table headings should be centered, and content justified. Tables should be numbered consecutively throughout the text (e.g., Table 1. Investment Structure). If the table is created by the author(s), it should be labeled: "Source: Compiled by the author(s)." If the data is borrowed, it should be referenced below: "Source: [Author, title of the work, year of publication, page]."
Maximum number of articles	No more than 2 articles per author
Maximum number of co-authors	No more than 2 co-authors per article
